## REGISTRATION INFO

**We offer three ways to register for our event:**

### ***FULL TIME CAMPING (on-site)***

The full time registration is 9/28 - 10/4 (T-shirts will be included within your registration)

This option is for those who intend to set up a tent or camper on site and remain the full length of the event.

Registration includes your campsite, one evening meal 9/28/26 (opening night), all workshops and programs, and a T-shirt for each member of your family over 6 years of age.

- RV: Each RV site has electric and water. Sites will be assigned. You will receive your campsite upon arrival. Please coordinate your own 3rd party RV rental if needed.
- Cabins: Cabins are limited in number. Please contact Amber for reservations at 253-970-9490.
- PRIMITIVE: Tent campsites do not have electric or water, but access to water is available around the campground. Guests using tents may have a total of 2 tents and 1 shade tent per site.

### ***FULL TIME OFFSITE ACCOMODATIONS***

This registration option is for those who intend to make other lodging arrangements and attend daily programs the full time of the event.

Registration includes one evening meal (opening night), all workshops/programs and T-shirt

### ***DAYPASS (non-camping)***

Day Pass is for those who would like to attend as their schedule allows. Day Pass rates are paid per day.

### Refunds:

If you need to cancel your registration prior to the event, please let us know by September 1st. Registration, minus the \$50 deposit, will be refundable.

After --9/1/26---, refunds will be determined on a case-by-case basis.

If you need to leave in the middle of the Feast, or if you are asked to leave by the Director, refunds may be forfeited to cover reserved camping fees. This will be decided on a case-by-case basis within 60 days of closing camp.

## CIRCLE E GUEST RANCH RULES

- We don't rent horses.
- ALL Horses must have a negative coggins with a 12 month period before unloading.
- ALL Horses entering the state of Tennessee must have a current and up to date Health Certificate
- ALL Riders & Campers MUST check in at the office to sign a Release and Wavier of Liability Agreement before entering the trails. You can print these off and bring them in as well.

### Trail Ride Rules

- Trail bosses and assistants have absolute authority.
- There is a one time \$5.00 cleaning fee for each stall. Your stall is clean when you get here, and the \$5.00 is for cleaning when you leave.
- No racing or rough riding on trails or in camp.
- Do not tie your horse to a tree or water spicket.
- Wire and rope pens are not allowed.
- No alcoholic beverages on the trails or in the tabernacle.
- We respect the right of all campers to enjoy the restful atmosphere at Circle E Ranch and request all campers be respectful to each other.
- Your camp must be quiet by 10 PM.
- Be considerate of others.
- No Electric Heaters are allowed; use your propane heaters.
- No vehicles cruising the camp after 10 PM.
- No weapons or firearms.
- No littering. The campground is clean when you arrive, so please keep it that way.
- Pets must be kept on a leash at all times.
- YOU are responsible for cleaning up after your pets.
- YOU will be responsible to provide your own animal waste bags.
- No unauthorized ATV's or motorcycles in camp or on the trails.
- We reserve the right to refuse any reservation.
- We reserve the right to ask anyone to leave.
- 5 miles per hour in camp.
- NO PETS ALLOWED ON TRAIL, OHV Rules & Policies
- All participants (including passengers/guests) must fill out a current waiver and check in at the office before entering the trail system.
- Check-in is required before entering the trail system on each visit.
- Litter laws are strictly enforced. Anyone caught littering will be PERMANENTLY EJECTED from the Park. Place litter in the appropriate trash receptacle or "Pack It In, Pack It Out!"
- Ride only on established trails. Do not venture into the woods or onto property not owned by the park. Obey all no trespassing signs or Private Property signs.
- All ATV riders and OHV must wear **DOT-approved helmets. No Exceptions.**
- Passengers are not allowed on ATVs, except for purpose-built two-passenger machines. No aftermarket or homemade seating for two is allowed.
- No rock crawlers or competition vehicles allowed in the park!
- No alcoholic beverages or mind-altering substances that may impair a person's judgment are allowed in the trail area.
- The discharge of firearms is STRICTLY PROHIBITED WITHIN THE PARK. NO HUNTING ALLOWED.
- Seat belts must be worn at ALL TIMES while driving in the park (passengers included).
- All operators of OHV vehicle and passengers should follow the manufacturer's safe operating procedures.
- All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) Off-Road Vehicles (ORVs), or Off Highway Vehicles (OHVS) are to be operated only during established park hours.
- Excessive speed and reckless driving is not permitted. Please follow posted speed limit signs.
- No speeding or tricks or spin-outs in the parking lot and grassy areas.
- Everyone rides at their own risk. Know your limitations and do not exceed the capabilities of your vehicle. The park IS NOT responsible for your recovery in the event of a breakdown or immobility but will always assist if possible.



## CIRCLE E GUEST RANCH RULES

- Do not remove or destroy trees, shrubs, plants or animals. We want them to remain for everyone to enjoy.
- Tree saver straps must always be used, No Exceptions, during winching and recovery.
- NO OPEN FIRES ARE ALLOWED IN THE PARK TRAILS. Campsite fires must be kept inside the designated campground area. Do not burn metal or glass in the fire.
- All operators of Off-Road Vehicles/Off Highway Vehicles must have a valid driver's license. Children under 18 must be supervised at all times and MUST wear a helmet.
- Be courteous to other drivers and children in the park. This is a family place!
- Those under the age of 18 must have a waiver consent signed by a parent or legal guardian in the presence of a park staff member. Parent/Legal guardian must closely supervise minors.
- ATB's are strongly discouraged inside of the camp. If they are driving from your site to the Trails that they need to use the outside roads located in camp at Frand to access to Trails. Please see Matt for trailhead.

## PROJECT E15 GUIDELINES

*Sukkot is the season of our JOY. This is a feast where we are commanded to be joyful. Please leave all contentions and strife outside the campgrounds. We encourage everyone to refrain from complaining, arguing, poor attitudes, and division.*

*(Alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the Tabernacle area or on the riding trails)*

Families: Parents, you are responsible for your children/minors. Please be aware of their whereabouts at all times.

Public Displays of Affection (PDA): Teens should refrain from showing PDA during Sukkot and are expected to keep their hands to themselves.

Curfew & Quiet Hours: All minors under 18 must be at their campsites or with their parents by 10:00 p.m. each evening. Please refrain from loud noises between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.

Respect Privacy: Please be mindful of boundaries. Children should not enter someone else's tent, RV, or cabin, take camping gear, or wander through campsites without permission.

Dress Code: Please keep shorts and skirts knee-length or longer. Avoid skintight attire. All tank tops should cover bras (including straps).

Drugs & Alcohol: No glass containers. Please keep drinking limited to personal campfires. Recreational use of illegal drugs will not be accepted.



## PROGRAMS & ACTIVITIES



**Dance Worship:** Dance circles will be formed each evening at service. We ask that the dancers be 10yr old and older for the safety of the children and dancers. Only experienced dancers will be allowed to dance in the center circle. Please wear appropriate attire if you plan to be dancing (no low tops, short skirts/shorts, shoes, etc.)

**Dance Offerings:** If you would like to perform a special dance offering during an evening service, Please see Amber Thornrbough

**Marketplace:** If you have a product you would like to sell, there will be a Marketplace on thursday between 10am and 2 pm at the amphitheatre. Your product could be essential oils, tzit-tzit, tees, homemade soaps, etc. You will be responsible for any supplies you need to set up your market space.

**Talent Offering:** If you would like to offer a talent during this fellowship, please contact Amber at (253)970-9490. Talents include singing, instrumentals, dance, or funny (and appropriate) jokes.



## PROGRAMS & ACTIVITIES



**Evening Services:** We expect for all campers to attend evening services. If you are unable to attend service, please do not roam the camp during this time. All minors must be with their adults during service times.

**Sabbath Observance:** We are a Sabbath keeping congregation. Please do not plan to set-up or tear down your campsite on the Sabbath. Your schedule will highlight this day and we encourage guests to purchase ice, groceries and plan tasks accordingly.

**Adult Workshops:** There will be various workshops thru the week. These will include specific times for men, women, and various teachings.

## AREAS OF VOLUNTEER SERVICE

All campers, 13 years and older, are expected to volunteer and serve periodically. Team leads have been selected for the following areas and may contact volunteers prior to our feast dates.

### Areas of Service

- Facility Monitors: These folks are VIP and a MUST at the campground. This team will check trashcans and the cleanliness of the camp throughout the week.
- Washroom Warriors: This is a very important job for the camp, and it will include the following duties: a sweep and spray down of bathrooms, sweeping and mopping, as well as refilling toilet paper and sanitizer inside the porta-potty's.
- Children & Youth Programs: If you have a child who is attending the program, please try to volunteer for a class. Volunteers may be teaching or supporting the main teachers and assisting as needed with games, crafts, etc.
- Coffee Keepers: These folks will be helping to monitor the tabernacle coffee pots through the week. A constant carafe of coffee should be available. Supplies will be provided for you.
